## Brentwood Bound Construction Progress

The transformative projects of the Brentwood Bound Plan are taking shape in our community.

Construction on the Deer Creek Flood Mitigation project and the Deer Creek Greenway Connector is on track to continue through December 2022.

In Summer 2021, members of the Brentwood Bound Community Engagement Task Force met to discuss the area formerly known as Norm West Park. The Task Force proposed a new name of Brentwood Park, to link the park's name to its location and to enhance residents' pride for their city. The new Brentwood Park will be the jewel of the Brentwood Parks system and a premier park in the metro area. The Board of Aldermen approved this name as well as the renaming of the current Brentwood Park (on Russell Avenue) to Brentwood Sports Complex.

Construction of an event lawn/comfort station building in the new Brentwood Park is well underway.

# Heating Equipment Safety Tips from Brentwood Fire Department



As temperatures decrease, it's important to ensure all your heating equipment is safe and functioning properly. Whether you use a furnace, a space heater, or fireplace, each needs to be inspected and cleaned. Heating equipment is a leading cause of fires, and this peaks during cold weather months.

**Furnaces** are the primary source of heating the home. Most of these use natural gas as the fuel source. Have your system and all gas appliances checked for proper operations. The primary concern when dealing with gas appliances that are malfunctioning is the production of carbon monoxide. Carbon monoxide has no color or odor, so it is undetectable without specialized equipment. Mild exposure can cause flu-like symptoms; prolonged exposure to elevated levels increases the risk of serious health issues and possibly death. Having a safety check of your furnace can prevent these issues.

**Space heaters** are often used to supplement heating within the home and are most often responsible for fires reported because of heating. When used properly and with safety in mind, space heaters are an efficient way to provide warmth. Keys to remember when using a space heater are to provide ample clearance space around the unit, ensure the unit has an automatic control for shutoff if the unit is tipped over, and never use the unit while sleeping.

**Fireplaces** are a welcoming spot in the home and provide additional warmth. They come in two styles: wood burning and gas supplied. Maintenance is the key for having a safe wood burning fireplace. The fireplace and the chimney need to be inspected annually to ensure there is no blockage of the flue with creosote (the residue from burning resins in firewood) or bird nests. The chimney cap should also be inspected as part of this process. Check the location of the damper control and know how to use it to ensure that proper ventilation occurs. Many flue fires are the result of a creosote buildup. In addition, burning the proper type of wood makes a difference. Hardwood, like oak, is preferred. Softer woods like pine have a higher resin content and burn very hot, producing higher creosote amounts.

Regardless of the type of heating you employ, remember that properly located and functioning **smoke and carbon monoxide detectors** are the key to completing your fire safe home heating plan.

## Safety and Awareness Tips from Brentwood Police Department

If you're ever in a dangerous situation, call 9-1-1 immediately.

- Walk with a purpose and stay off your phone. Be aware of your surroundings.
- If you are shopping alone and feel uncomfortable about walking to your car, ask store security to escort you to your vehicle.
- When walking to your vehicle, have your keys in your hand, scan the interior of your vehicle before entering, and lock your doors immediately.
- Avoid carrying a large purse, and if you do, keep it close to your body. Should someone grab your purse, do not resist; your safety is worth more than the replaceable items in the purse.
- Avoid contact with strangers. A common theme is to be distracted away from your purse so someone else can steal your wallet.
- While dining, be careful where you hang your purse, as others maybe able to remove your wallet.
- In your vehicle, stay off your phone. Have a plan for where you park. Park in well-lit areas around other vehicles.
- Avoid warming your car. Thieves are opportunistic. Lock your vehicle, and always take your keys/fob with you.
- Do not leave valuables and packages in open view inside your vehicle. This is a personal invite for strangers to break in.
- When pumping gas, lock your car doors. Thieves have been known to enter your car and steal items while you're pumping gas.

## CodeRED Notification System: Weather Warning Alert Option

In Fall 2020, Brentwood updated its CodeRED Community Notification System to include CodeRED Weather Warning, in order to provide residents and businesses with automated severe weather alerts. Those who choose to opt in to this service will receive flash flood, tornado and severe thunderstorm warnings just moments after an alert has been issued by the National Weather Service.

Residents and businesses who have already signed up for Brentwood CodeRED notifications and wish to activate the Weather Warning Alert options will need to register for CodeRED again. To activate these severe weather warnings, click on the "Brentwood CodeRED" icon on the home page of [brentwoodmo.org](http://brentwoodmo.org) or text WARNME to 99411 from your mobile phone. **There is no charge to residents or businesses for this service.**

Residents and businesses who have not previously signed up for CodeRED notifications may do so at any time by clicking on the "Brentwood CodeRED" icon on the home page of [brentwoodmo.org](http://brentwoodmo.org).

We will continue to send other public safety notifications, such as road closures or specific emergency situations, through the CodeRED system. 




