

City of Brentwood Trash, Recycling and Yard Waste Service

The City of Brentwood operates its own Sanitation Department under the supervision of the Public Works Department. The Sanitation Department is responsible for the collection of trash, recycling and yard waste for single-family homes and Brentwood Forest Condominiums. **This service is offered at no charge to residents.**

Trash, Recycling and Yard Waste Collection Procedure in Brentwood Forest

The Sanitation Department collects regular trash and recycling at the Brentwood Forest Condominiums each **Monday**. A second trash collection occurs each **Thursday**, but not a second recycling collection.

Effective October 2020, the Brentwood Forest Condominium Association has required its residents to place trash in trash receptacles instead of in plastic bags placed at the curb.

Multi-family residential units (four or more units) must place trash in containers that are leak-proof and covered (per Section 607.080 of the St. Louis County municipal codes). Brentwood Forest residents are to provide their own receptacles. City of Brentwood's Sanitation Department no longer collects any loose trash bags that are not placed in trash receptacles.

Recycling Bins and What to Recycle

The City of Brentwood's Public Works Department provides small recycling carts or bins to Brentwood Forest residents at no charge. Residents should place acceptable recyclable items within these receptacles. Flattened cardboard or other acceptable recyclable items may be placed outside/next to the receptacles if they are not comingled with trash or non-acceptable recyclables.

Stick with the Six acceptable items for recycling:

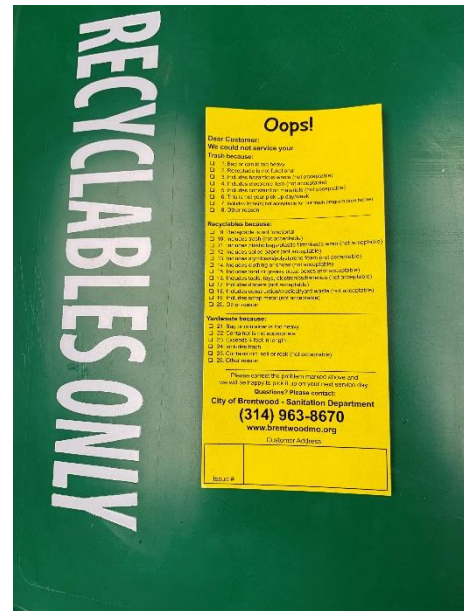
- Paper
- Flattened Cardboard
- Plastic Bottles and Containers
- Glass Bottles and Jar
- Metal Food and Beverage Cans
- Food and Beverage Cartons



Oops! Stickers

Sanitation Department staff place “Oops” stickers on trash and recycling receptacles that violate trash and recycling practices. For example, if a resident combines plastic bags with recyclable items or places trash inside a recycling receptacle, the Sanitation staff will not collect the contents and will leave an “Oops” sticker on the receptacle.

Staff enter the address on the tear-off portion of the sticker so the Public Works Department will have this information if the resident contacts Public Works with questions about the rejected trash or recycling.

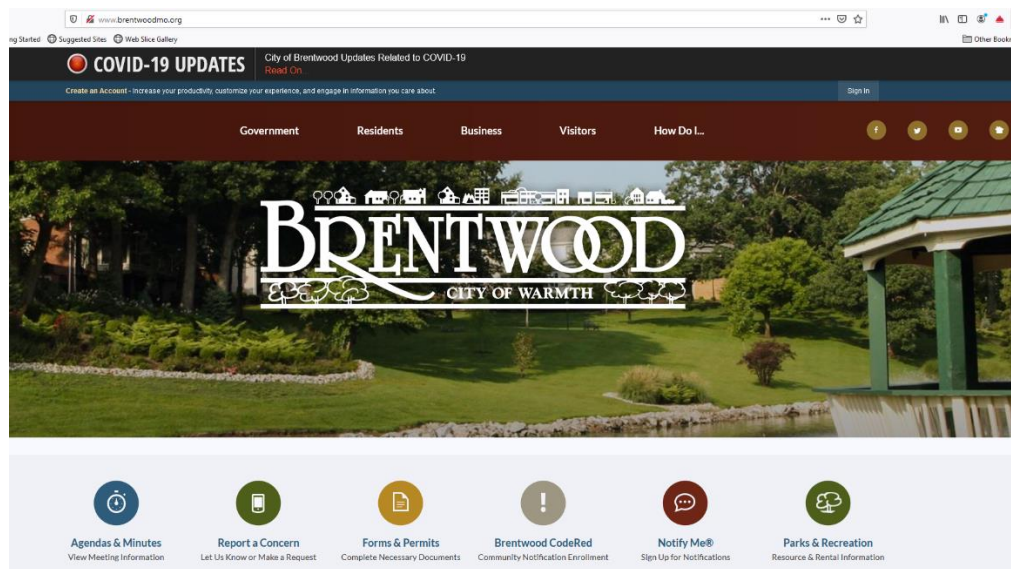


Contacting Public Works/Sanitation

If the Sanitation crew misses picking up your trash or recycling items, or if you receive an “Oops” sticker, you may: **Call the Public Works Department, 314.963.8670 OR**

Submit the information through the MyGov request-tracking system via the “Report a Concern” icon on the home page of the City of Brentwood website, www.brentwoodmo.org. Residents can submit this information using a smartphone, tablet or computer.

- Click on the “Report a Concern” icon
- Complete the items marked with an asterisk in sections 1 and 2
 - Select category: Sanitation
 - Select subcategory: Missed Trash Pickup
- Click the Submit Request button

Examples



UNACCEPTABLE:

- Loose bags of trash, not placed in the trash receptacle
- Recyclable cardboard placed on non-recycling day, along with plastic bag/trash placed in cardboard box



ACCEPTABLE:

- Proper placement of trash and recycling receptacles on Monday collection day
- Proper placement of trash receptacles along the curb
