Brentwood Bound Construction Progress

Manchester Road Closure: May Through August 2022

Black Creek Bridge on Manchester Road (just west of the intersection with Hanley Road) will close on May 2 and remain fully closed through August 2022.

This full roadway closure will prevent traffic from going west from Hanley Road to Manchester Road. The closure also will prevent traffic from going east on Manchester Road to Hanley Road.

Throughout the closure, vehicles will still be able to access businesses and residences along the Manchester Road corridor from Brentwood Boulevard.

During the same time, work will take place on the pedestrian tunnel near Mary Avenue. This work will reduce Manchester Road traffic to one lane in each travel direction.

Deer Creek Flood Mitigation Manchester Road Improvements Deer Creek Greenway Connector

Deer Creek Greenway Connector Groundbreaking: April 28

The City of Brentwood and its partner Great Rivers Greenway will break ground on the Deer Creek Greenway Connector on Thursday, April 28. The groundbreaking will begin at 10:30 am at 8740 Manchester Road, in the parking area south of Arby's overlooking the Brentwood Bound project site.

The City of Brentwood and Great Rivers Greenway are partnering on the planning, design and construction of a new paved greenway connection between Rogers Parkway and the Deer Creek Greenway at Brentwood Boulevard and Marshall Avenue.

The Deer Creek Greenway currently stretches 2.16 miles between the Deer Creek Shopping Center through Deer Creek Park in Maplewood to Lorraine Davis Park in Webster Groves.

When complete, the Deer Creek Greenway Connector will create a paved, accessible walking and biking trail linking Brentwood's Memorial Park (with sidewalk access to Brentwood Promenade and Brentwood Pointe shopping centers) to Lorraine Davis Park, Barnickel Park and Deer Creek Park in Webster Groves, Deer Creek Park in Maplewood and the Deer Creek Shopping Center at Big Bend Boulevard.

The Deer Creek Greenway Connector will also link to these parks and amenities within Brentwood:

NEW Brentwood Park | Amphitheater, Destination Playground and Water Play Feature, Event Pavilion

Hanley Park | Basketball Court, Pickleball Court, Sand Volleyball Court, Dog Park

Oak Tree Park | Natural Area, Pavilion, Playground

Memorial Park | Inline Hockey Rink, Pavilion, Playgrounds

Brentwood Sports Complex | Baseball/Softball Fields, Soccer Field, Playground



CodeRED/OnSolve Emergency Notification

Sign up to receive notifications of impending emergencies, weather alerts, or critical community alerts via phone, email or text. Click the CodeRED button on the home page of brentwoodmo.org or call 314.962.4800 to sign up. Download the **CodeRED Mobile Alert by Onsolve LLC** mobile app for real-time, location-specific alerts.

Knox HomeBox Loan Program

The Brentwood Fire Department offers a 90-day Knox HomeBox loan program for residents who have a temporary special need or physical disability preventing them from opening their front door to Brentwood fire and medical personnel in event of an emergency. Call 314.963.8612.

MAGIC Bus

This free service is designed to transport Brentwood residents age 60 and older or adults with disabilities to destinations within Brentwood and surrounding communities. To learn more, call 314.963.8685.

Medication Disposal

Deposit acceptable items directly into the medication disposal drop box located inside the Brentwood Police Department lobby, 8 am to 4 pm Monday through Friday.

From Brentwood Fire Department: It's OK to Call 911

The Brentwood Fire Department staff enjoys speaking with residents, but there are times when it is best to call and speak with the 911 dispatchers. Instead of calling the fire station to report instances of someone injured or not feeling well, powerlines down, smell of smoke in a home, fire alarms "beeping" or activated, calling 911 is the best option.

Area 911 dispatchers are trained to quickly determine the severity of a reported situation and to direct the closest and most appropriate resource to manage these situations, whether help is needed quickly or not.

It is OK to call 911. Fire and medical units regularly train away from the firehouse or can be away helping others and would be unavailable to answer the phone. Rather than calling the Brentwood firehouse for help, save precious time and call 911 to report an emergency or request for service.

Be Warned About the Weather: CodeRED Notification System Weather Warning Alert Option

Brentwood's CodeRED Community Notification System includes CodeRED Weather Warning, which provides residents and businesses with automated severe weather alerts. Those who choose to opt in to this service will receive flash flood, tornado and severe thunderstorm warnings just moments after an alert has been issued by the National Weather Service.

Residents and businesses who have already signed up for Brentwood CodeRED notifications and wish to activate the Weather Warning Alert options will need to register for CodeRED again. To activate these severe weather warnings, click on the "Brentwood CodeRED" icon on the home page of brentwoodmo.org or text WARNME to 99411 from your mobile phone. **There is no charge to residents or businesses for this service.**

Residents and businesses who have not previously signed up for CodeRED notifications may do so at any time by clicking on the "Brentwood CodeRED" icon on the home page of brentwoodmo.org.

The City of Brentwood will continue to send other public safety notifications, such as road closures or specific emergency situations, through the CodeRED system. The City of Brentwood CodeRED Assistance Line is 314.963.6710. Please leave your name and phone number, and a staff member will return your call as soon as possible.

Report a Concern, Make a Request

Make requests (such as vacation checks or household item pick-ups) or submit concerns through the MyGov request-tracking system via the home page of brentwoodmo.org. Click on the "Report a Concern" button, choose a category and submit your request. You'll receive feedback when the request is received and also will receive updates as the request is investigated by City staff.

Reminders to Homeowners

Brentwood homeowners are responsible for mowing and maintaining the area between the street and the sidewalk along their property. Overhanging brush, overhanging tree limbs and high weeds need to be cut back to ensure a clear and safe passage along the sidewalk, per Municipal Code sections 505.070 and 505.090.

Brentwood's Municipal Code also prohibits short-term rentals.

Brentwood Celebrates U.S. Women's Hockey Champ Alex Cavallini



Mayor David Dimmitt proclaimed April 4, 2022, "Alex Cavallini Day" in the City of Brentwood and presented the U.S. Women's Hockey goaltender with the key to the city at the Board of Aldermen meeting.

Alex is a Brentwood resident and Olympic hockey star. She has represented the United States at two Olympic Winter Games. She was a member of the silver medal-winning U.S. Women's Hockey team in 2022 and the gold medal-winning team in 2018. She has won multiple world championships, played in professional women's hockey leagues, and was an All-American player at the University of Wisconsin.

As a member of the U.S. Women's National Team, she earned a spot on seven international Ice Hockey Federation Women's World Championship teams, played in six Four Nations Cups, and has represented the United States in various other international events.

With the Calgary Inferno, she helped the team win the Clarkson Cup and was named Canadian Women's Hockey League goaltender of the year in 2018-2019.

She was the first woman ever to be drafted in the United States Hockey League.

On April 10, Brentwood Parks and Recreation hosted an "Alex Cavallini Day Celebration" at the Brentwood Ice Rink.

From Brentwood Police Department: Flock Cameras

The City of Brentwood has partnered with Flock Safety camera systems to install several license plate reader cameras in and around Brentwood. This new technology provides Brentwood police officers with immediate notifications when a vehicle that is wanted for a crime enters the Brentwood jurisdiction.

Since the installation of these cameras, Brentwood officers have interrupted countless car break-ins, identified stolen vehicles, and made several felony arrests as a direct result of notifications from Flock. As private businesses and neighborhood associations begin to show interest in these cameras, the Police Department looks forward to continued success in using this technology to assist with protecting the City of Brentwood.

As a reminder: To help discourage thieves from coming to Brentwood, lock your car doors and keep valuables out of your vehicles; this includes firearms, extra keys, electronics, purses, wallets, garage door openers, and anything else of value.

Brentwood Receives \$300,000 Grant for Wetland Project

The City of Brentwood received a \$300,000 grant from the Missouri Department of Resources' Division of Environmental Quality, Soil and Water Conservation Program. The grant will allow the City to design and construct an extended wetland pond north of the confluence of Deer Creek and Black Creek.

With this grant funding, Brentwood can enhance the design of the confluence point to aid in flood mitigation as well as to confer significant water quality benefits.

The .75 acre pond will have .25 acres dedicated as a wetland for water quality treatment. The design will incorporate a varied topography to allow pockets of runoff to form shallow semi-permanent to permanent pools for optimal plant and wildlife habitat.

Installation of shallow emergent zones with native species and a heterogeneous mix of plants will improve the biological diversity of the site.

Construction on this project is scheduled to begin in spring or summer 2022, as weather permits.


