**Deer Creek Flood Mitigation Manchester Road Improvements
Deer Creek Greenway Connector**

Deer Creek Flood Mitigation

**Construction Timeline:
8/2020-12/2022**

Stormwater flooding has inundated the area along Deer Creek between Hanley Road and South Brentwood Boulevard 26 times since 1957, creating significant public safety issues and causing property damage. The Deer Creek Flood Mitigation project includes the planning, design and construction of improvements to the Deer Creek channel and floodplain to alleviate ongoing flooding problems and protect properties from frequent flooding.

Improvements include:

- Streambank stabilization
- Native vegetation planting
- Natural floodplain restoration (benching and widening)

The improvements will:

- Improve public safety
- Revitalize an underutilized area of the City by creating an opportunity for the development of the entire Manchester Road Corridor in Brentwood
- Reduce emergency response and flood clean-up costs and increase taxable revenue
- Reduce number of flood-prone properties
- Restore floodplain

Manchester Road Improvements

**Construction Timeline:
8/2021-12/2023**

The Missouri Department of Transportation is planning to resurface Manchester Road between Lindbergh Boulevard and Big Bend Boulevard. The City of Brentwood is working with MoDOT to enhance the roadway, improve pedestrian access and safety, and enhance the overall appearance of Manchester Road in Brentwood.

Improvements include:

- Mill and overlay pavement
- Improve drainage along corridor
- Sidewalk and accessibility improvements
- Manchester Road bridge replacement near Hanley Road
- Pedestrian tunnel at intersection of Manchester Road and Mary Avenue
- Traffic signal upgrades
- Decorative street signage and lighting
- Manchester Road bridge enhancements near Hanley Road over Black Creek
- Accessible 6' curbs and 5' sidewalks on the north side
- Accessible 6' curbs and 10' shared use path on the south side

Deer Creek Greenway Connector

Construction Timeline: 9/2021-12/2022

Trail connection from Rogers Parkway, north of Manchester Road to the Deer Creek Greenway

Elements include:

- Trailhead with parking
- Additional parking for the new Brentwood Park
- Greenway linking multiple parks
- .65-mile long paved trail
- Potential to connect more than 28 miles of greenways
- In conjunction with other components of the plan, there is potential for a 3K and 5K race route
- Greenspaces throughout the revitalized area

Brentwood Receives \$300,000 Grant for Wetland Project

The City of Brentwood received a \$300,000 grant from the Missouri Department of Resources' Division of Environmental Quality, Soil and Water Conservation Program. The grant will allow the City to design and construct an extended wetland pond north of the confluence of Deer Creek and Black Creek.

With this grant funding, Brentwood can enhance the design of the confluence point to aid in flood mitigation as well as to confer significant water quality benefits.

The wetland pond will be supplied with runoff from the existing parking lot to 8030 Manchester Road, and from two new storm sewers that will run along the realigned Brentwood Industrial Drive and Breckenridge Industrial Court. The stormwater wetland will use varied grading from 0.25 feet to 9 feet below the culvert for water quality treatment, with water held by wetland plants and pocket grading. This shallow wetland will provide 22,113 cubic feet of volume for water quality treatment.

The .75 acre pond will have .25 acres dedicated as a wetland for water quality treatment. The design will incorporate a varied topography to allow pockets of runoff to form shallow semi-permanent to permanent pools for optimal plant and wildlife habitat.

Shallow emergent zones with native species and a heterogeneous mix of plants will be installed to improve the biological diversity of the site.



Fireplace Safety Tips from Brentwood Firefighters



As we enter the season of cooler temperatures, Brentwood firefighters share these fireplace safety tips:

- Have your chimney professionally inspected and cleaned at least once each year.
- Make sure the chimney cap is in good shape to keep out rain, birds, squirrels and other animals.
- Check the interior of the fireplace and flue for creosote buildup. Creosote is flammable, and too much build-up is a fire hazard.
- Only burn dry, seasoned fire wood.
- Only burn hardwoods such as oak, maple, ash and birch. These woods burn cleaner and hotter and contain less sap, thus creating less creosote.
- Any time there is smoke indoors from your fireplace, check to ensure the flue is open. If the flue is open, you may have an obstruction in the flue pipe, which requires immediate attention.
- To improve your fireplace's safety and efficiency, consider installing heat-proof glass doors to protect against heat loss and a fan or blower to direct heat into the room. The doors can also prevent embers from popping out of the firebox and into the living space. At a minimum, use a fireplace screen.
- Remove flammable rugs, blankets and home décor from in front of the firebox.
- Do not burn plastics, tissue or wrapping paper in your fireplace.
- Clean the interior of your fireplace regularly. Sweep up ashes and place them in a metal container until they are completely cooled. Do not place the ashes in the trash can until you are sure they have had sufficient time to burn out completely. Many house fires are caused due to hot ashes being placed in trash bins too soon.
- If you notice loud cracking and/or popping noise, dense smoke, intense hot smells or explosive burning, you may have a flue fire. In this event, exit your home and call 911 immediately.



“Talk with the Hawk”: Call the Police if You See Something Suspicious

In Brentwood, our schools are in our neighborhoods. This means kids walk and ride their bikes to school. Keep an eye out, keep the phones down, and go slow! We are taking speed enforcement very seriously in our neighborhoods to best protect our citizens.

Keep in mind these basic recommendations: Lock your car doors, lock your homes, keep valuables out of sight, and call 911 when you see suspicious activity – no matter the time of day! In the last month, your Brentwood Officers identified three vehicles with suspects committing vehicle crimes and were able to interrupt further criminal activity.






