FROM THE DESK OF MAYOR DIMMITT:

This is the third in the series of articles looking at the City's five departments. The purpose of these articles is hopefully to give you a better understanding of the services provided by Brentwood and how we fund those services. The first two articles looked at our Fire Department (Winter, 2024) and our Police Department (Spring, 2025). This issue will look at our Public Works Department.



Of the five public-facing departments the City has, the Public Works Department probably has the greatest impact on your life on a day-to-day basis. This department maintains our streets, sidewalks and curbs; picks up trash, recycling and yard waste, operates the Sewer Lateral Program and keeps all of our equipment in sound working condition.

One of the residents' favorite amenities or services provided by the City is sanitation. Brentwood is one of the few communities 1) that keeps its sanitation department in-house, meaning we do not contract with or outsource it to a third party; and 2) that provides sanitation services to its residents at no cost. Based upon my conversations with the residents, I would say the sanitation staff are some of the most beloved employees we have. These dedicated public servants are out on the streets keeping our neighborhoods clean whether the temperature is below zero or above 100 degrees.

Our Public Works Department also maintains our streets, curbs and sidewalks. They're either filling potholes, repairing broken curbs or fixing uneven sidewalk slabs. For instance, last year the department repaired more than 600 linear feet of sidewalk. They also managed the milling and overlaying of Brentwood's portion of McKnight Road from Litzsinger to York.

Many of you, if you've lived here long enough, probably have taken advantage of the City's Sewer Lateral Program, which is managed by the Public Works Department. Each year, every homeowner pays \$50 into the City's Sewer Lateral Program Fund. These dollars are then used to help subsidize the cost of repair of a resident's broken sewer lateral. Because of efforts of the Board of Aldermen, this program is now self-sufficient.

Finally, the employees of our Public Works Department maintain much of the City's capital—whether that is buildings, cars, trucks or other types of equipment. Our Public Work's building has a garage where you can usually find a truck or police vehicle being serviced.

The 2025–2026 school year begins on August 18. Below see important information about pick-up and drop-off procedures at Brentwood schools. Increased traffic around school buildings during arrival and dismissal times can impact nearby streets, and we appreciate your awareness and patience.

Brentwood High & Middle Schools

Times: 7:45–8:05 AM & 2:50–3:10 PM

Affected Streets:

- High School Drive
- Circle Drive (in front of the schools)

Avoid High School Drive during these times if possible.

Mark Twain Elementary

Times: 7:45–8:00 AM & 3:00–3:20 PM

Affected Streets:

- Litzsinger Road (near Dorothy Ave)
- Dorothy Avenue
- Helen Avenue
- Henrietta Avenue

One-way traffic flow is in place around the school block—watch for detours and signage.

McGrath Elementary

Affected Streets:

- St. Clair Avenue
- High School Drive (near St. Clair exit)

Traffic backs up during pick-up and drop-off; use caution around crossing areas.

Brentwood High School Celebrates Class of 2025

Brentwood High School's 97th graduating class crossed the stage on May 21, marking the end of one chapter and the beginning of the next. The Class of 2025 distinguished itself through academic achievement, creative expression, athletic excellence and a deep commitment to community.

Of the 55 graduates, 43 will continue their education at two- or four-year colleges, while others are pursuing advanced training, workforce opportunities or vocational support services. Collectively, the class earned more than \$2.8 million in scholarships and submitted 226 college applications to 117 institutions nationwide.

Principal Dr. Edward Johnson applauded students for their character and leadership, noting their accomplishments in athletics, the arts and community service. "You didn't build walls — you built community," he said. "You found a way to have fun, to leave your mark and to make us all proud."

Superintendent Dr. Amy Zielinski addressed the Class of 2025, commending their passion, kindness and resilience. "You've brought joy and laughter to our hallways and reminded all of us that while academics matter, spirit and character matter just as much," she said.

Student speakers reflected on the friendships, challenges and triumphs that shaped their high school journey — from navigating a global pandemic to enduring flooding, construction and a tornado that delayed their original graduation date. "Take time to look at yourself and be proud of the person you have become, even through times of adversity," said senior Emma Trostel.

This year's graduates earned more than 60 scholarships, including 24 A+ Program candidates and six Missouri Bright Flight recipients. Seven students earned National Career Readiness Certificates, six completed industry certification programs through South Technical High School, five signed letters of intent to compete in collegiate athletics, and three were awarded the Missouri Seal of Biliteracy for proficiency in a second language.

Street Sweeper Etiquette: Help Keep Brentwood Clean

Move Vehicles: Please avoid parking on the street during scheduled sweeping days. This allows sweepers to do a thorough job.

Keep Curbs Clear: Remove trash bins, yard waste, and other items from the curb area.

Be Patient & Safe: Give sweepers space to work. Do not try to pass them while they're operating.

Stay Informed: Look for posted signs or check the City's website for your area's sweeping schedule.

Bulk Item Pickup – Need to dispose of large items like mattresses or furniture? Residents can schedule a bulk item pickup through our sanitation services. For details, fees, and scheduling information call 314.962.4800.

CodeRED Emergency Notification System – Stay informed about emergencies, weather alerts, and critical community updates via phone, email, or text. Sign up at <https://brentwoodmo.org/389/CodeRED> or call 314.963.6710. You can also download the CodeRED Mobile Alert app for real-time, location-specific alerts.

Knox HomeBox Loan Program – Residents with a temporary special need or physical disability can borrow a Knox HomeBox for up to 90 days, allowing emergency responders to access their home quickly if needed. Medication Disposal – A medication disposal drop box is available in the Brentwood Police Department lobby Monday through Friday, 8 AM to 4 PM, for the safe disposal of unused medications.

Medical Training Collaboration – Brentwood's police and fire departments work together to ensure rapid, high-quality emergency medical response through continuous training and collaboration.

Notary Services – Need a document notarized? Brentwood City Hall has a notary available Monday - Friday from 8 AM - 4:30 PM.

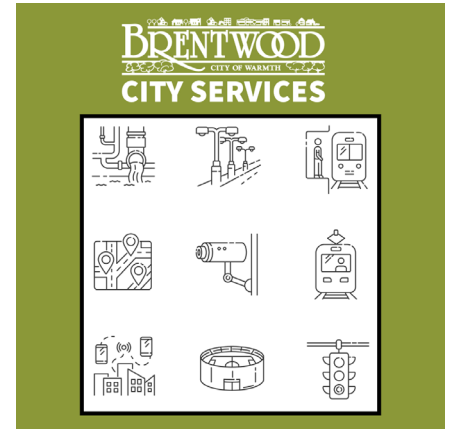

Beginning **Monday, August 4**, residents will be required to pay at the time of request for household bulk item pickup services. This change replaces the previous system where residents were invoiced after their items were collected.

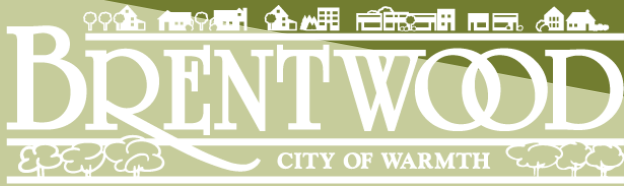
